

# Story of Inspiration

At 16, Chandra Shekhar Kumar Sha from Jahada-2 noticed a troubling weakness in his left limb that soon made walking, sitting, and standing difficult. He visited BPKIHS in Dharan, but no diagnosis emerged. His search continued in Siliguri, but again, no clarity came. The weakness spread to his right side, worsening by the day.

Finally, in AIMS hospital, Delhi, he was diagnosed with Guillain-Barré Syndrome. A three-month treatment regimen, including physiotherapy, brought some relief. After recovering, he returned home to complete his higher secondary education and continued regular physiotherapy.

His journey didn't end with recovery. In 2064 BS, he was elected Chairperson of the newly formed Organization of persons with disabilities in Jahada-2. Chandra Shekhar devoted himself to empowering others with disabilities, promoting income-generating activities, and advocating for disability-inclusive development.

By 2079 BS, his dedication earned him the position of Ward Chairperson of Jahada-2. Today, Chandra Shekhar continues to fight for a more inclusive society, allocating funds and advocating for accessible services and infrastructure for all.
