Reshaping Res Bahadur's future



Res Bahadur Limbu, the eldest son of Dambar Bahadur Limbu and Sita Limbu from Deumai Municipality was born initially healthy but later his development was delayed, prompting medical consultations at Mangalbare Health Post and later Kanti Hospital in Kathmandu. Therapy was suggested but they did not follow up which later left him in a critical condition, unable to move independently.

Karuna Foundation Nepal provided Res with a wheelchair, through the program (DPRP) so that he could attend school. Although initially uninterested in education, Res then began attending school with his sister. Physiotherapy and counseling for his parents were initiated, supported by the program. Regular therapy brought noticeable improvements, enabling Res to sit on a bamboo stool.

Res goes to school, can pronounce letters and is learning and trying to write. His speech is not clear, but he smiles, talks, and socializes more, enjoying school. His parents have become more involved in his therapy, witnessing his progress and have reshaped their outlook on his future.
