Procedure for Distribution of Identity Cards for Persons with Disabilities, 2075 (2018)

(a) Profound Disability:

Individuals in the following conditions will be provided with a 'Category A' identity card, which will be issued in a red color.

1. Individuals with severe impairments in their physical, mental, or sensory systems, leading to extreme functional limitations, making daily life very difficult even with assistance from others.
2. Those who cannot perform even basic daily activities on their own and require support from others, individuals with severe intellectual disabilities, individuals significantly affected by autism, and those who are completely blind and deaf.
3. Individuals with two or more types of physical, mental, or sensory impairments, requiring assistance from others for almost all daily activities.
4. Individuals with mental and psychosocial disabilities, who require continuous intensive care, regular medication and supervision by doctors and caregivers.

(B) Severe Disability:

Individuals in the following conditions will be provided with a 'Category B' identity card, which will be issued in blue color.

1. Individuals with physical, mental or sensory impairment, who face difficulties in movement, communication, and performing daily activities, even with continuous or frequent support from caregivers, interpreters, or human guides.
2. Individuals requiring a wheelchair for daily mobility due to conditions such as cerebral palsy, spinal cord injuries or paralysis, hemophilia, muscular disorders, or other impairments affecting the back, hands, knees, or waist.
3. Individuals who have lost or are unable to use both arms from the shoulders or below, those who have lost or cannot use both arms and legs due to various reasons, those who have lost or cannot use the lower body below the waist, and those who must use crutches due to non-functional legs.
4. Individuals who are categorized under the definition of blindness or complete blindness.
5. Individuals who are completely deaf and require continuous interpretation support for communication, individuals with intellectual disabilities or autism who face challenges in learning and performing daily activities, and individuals with multiple disabilities who require constant assistance.

(C) Moderate Disability:

Individuals in the following conditions will be provided with a 'Category C' identity card, which will be issued in yellow color.

1. Individuals who can independently perform daily activities, including walking, with the help of assistive devices such as prosthetic limbs, calipers, or specialized shoes.
2. Individuals whose impairment is limited to the lower leg (below the knee) but can walk without assistive devices.
3. Individuals who have lost or cannot use one arm below the shoulder or forearm, or those unable to perform tasks requiring functions of a hand.
4. Individuals who have lost the thumb and index finger of both hands below the palm.
5. Individuals who don't have the part below the ankle in both feet but can walk.
6. Individuals with spinal issues causing a hunched back.
7. Individuals with intellectual disabilities or autism who experience learning delay but can independently perform daily activities.
8. Individuals with partial hearing loss, who can hear only loud sounds or can hear with the help of a hearing aid.
9. Individuals who have undergone surgery to remove the vocal cords.
10. Individuals with unclear speech due to cleft lip and palate.
11. Individuals with severe stuttering, including frequent repetition of words or syllables.
12. Individuals shorter than three feet in height.
13. Individuals with both visual and hearing impairments who require glasses and hearing aids, as well as those with low vision who can read only with the help of lenses or magnifiers.
14. Individuals with hereditary bleeding disorders (such as hemophilia), who face difficulty in walking daily.
15. Individuals with mental or psychosocial disabilities, who require regular medication, but can independently manage their daily activities.

(D) Mild Disability:

Individuals in the following conditions will be provided with a 'Category D' identity card, which will be issued in white color.

1. Individuals with mild physical, mental, or sensory impairments, who can independently perform daily activities.
2. Individuals with short arms or legs, those who have lost or cannot use one hand below the palm, those who have lost at least the thumb and index finger of one hand below the palm, or those who have at least the thumb and index finger remaining on both hands below the palm.
3. Individuals with low vision, who can read large print.
4. Individuals who are missing all toes on both feet.
5. Individuals with partial hearing loss, who require a hearing aid to hear loud sounds but have clear speech.
